Gunnar Asker, featured speaker at ASSE Dinner Meeting on September 6 in New York at PEKING Restaurant 100 Park Avenue (Corner East 40th Street and Park Avenue NW corner, has put together a photo display of Swedish Navy pictures on a large white display board measuring 4 feet high and 6 feet long of 8 large Navy Photos in 3 rows. Top row: Train Ferry , Auxiliary mine layer and cruiser "Drottning Victoria" and The Flag Ship HMS "SVERIGE" followed by a picture showing Home Fleet Staff Chaplain giving a sermon between the two aft 28 cm guns before the entire ships crew. The second row: Shows 4 destroyers tied up "Pearl Harbour" fashion side by side. The next photo shows smoke billowing up from 3 sunken destroyers at the so called "Harsfjarden Disaster". This was Swedens "Pearl Harbor" which happened September 17, 1941 about 3 months before Pearl Harbor. The third row: A panoramic view of the Swedish Home Fleet (Kust Flottan) in June 1945 one month after the cease fire in Europe. This picture shows the 3 pocket battle ships, Sverige, Drottning Victoria and Gustav V and the cruisers Fylgia and Gotland and the auxiliary Alvsnabben and some smaller craft. The Home Fleet had not been seen in Stockholm harbor since 1939 when the war in Europe broke out. This is truly a historic photo display. Events which occurred during 1939-45 will never occur again. If Sweden gets into a tight political situation again, let us hope not, it will be under entirely different circumstances. Finally there is a picture showing Gunnar Asker in 1946 in discussion with Captain Stokes of the US Naval Academy, when Gunnar was Technical Naval Attache in Washington during 1945-47.
